Dr. Barros graduated in Veterinary Medicine from the Federal University of Santa Maria, Brazil, in 1969. He then received his PhD in Veterinary Pathology at Colorado State University in 1980, and did a Post-Doctorate at the Veterinary Pathology Institute of Justus Liebig Universität Giessen, Germany, in 1984. He was a Professor of Pathology at the Federal University of Santa Maria, Rio Grande do Sul, Brazil (1971-2014), and Visiting Professor at Federal University of Mato Grosso do Sul, Brazil (2014-2020)

Amongst his many accolades, Claudio was a Member of the Consulting Scientific Committee for Transmissible Spongiform Encephalopathies to the Brazilian Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Supply and a member of the Brazilian College of Animal Pathology. He is an Emeritus Member of the Brazilian Association of Veterinary Pathology and Honorary Member of the American College of Veterinary Pathologists. He was the Editor in Chief of "Pesquisa Veterinária Brasileira" (Brazilian Journal of Veterinary Research) for many years. He was the recipient of the Paulo Dacorso Filho award, 2016 edition, conferred by the Federal Council of Veterinary Medicine of Brazil. Claudio has been a teacher and mentor of many generations of Brazilian pathologists and he is one of the greatest pathologists in Latin America and the world.

WHO knew?

Participants Review of Primer on the WHO Classification of Lymphoma

On 24th July, Dr. Amy Durham (University of Pennsylvania) gave a wonderful introduction to the diagnostic approach for the WHO classification system in lymphoma. Aimed at residents, trainees and individuals who haven't had experience in applying this classification system, Dr. Durham provided the basic algorithm for lymphoma subtyping, as well as a brief review of current and future additional diagnostics.

The diagnostic steps provided are straightforward, and covered in detail during the talk:

- 1. Is it lymphoma?
- 2. Is it a nodular or diffuse expansion?
- 3. What are the size of the cells (small, medium, large)?
- 4. Are there mitoses (this affects the grade of lymphoma, with high grade lymphomas being >10 mitoses/40X field)?
- 5. What is the immunophenotype (B-cell, plasma cell, T-cell, other)?

Following a thorough explanation of the algorithm, several cases were reviewed to ensure the material sunk in. A truly useful talk that left me frantically taking notes; the useful visual aids, flow charts and tables would make any systematic pathologist's mind squeal with glee!

Clinical History: Two 2-day-old nestling racing pigeons were submitted for postmortem examination and diagnostic work-up. Both birds belonged to a small racing pigeon loftin which massive mortality of nestlings had recently happened. A full necropsy was performed on both birds. Liver samples from both birds were collected, inoculated onto Mac Conkey and blood agar plates and incubated aerobically at 37°C for 24 h. In addition, several organs of both pigeons were sampled and fixed in 10% buffered formalin for 48 h, before being processed routinely to produce hematoxylin and eosin (H&E) sections.

Necropsy Findings: A remarkable atrophy of the bursasof Fabricius was noted in both birds. **Ancillary Testing:** No bacterial growth was observed on the Mac Conkey and blood agar plates inoculated with liver from each bird.

An Egg-citing Day!

Participants Review of Diseases of Poultry

On 21st July, the Davis-Thompson Foundation wowed us with a day of RACE-accredited continuing education on poultry disease. The major diseases were covered, with the spotlight placed on neoplasia, clostridial diseases and histopathology.

First off, was Dr. Brigid Troan (North Carolina Zoological Park) who explored neoplasia in poultry. She highlighted the age-old adage which gets tossed around the pathology world: "Every backyard chicken has Marek's, unless proven otherwise!" To start she contrasted neoplastic lymphocytes with normal populations by giving us an overview of the "Home Sweet Home" of lymphoid aggregates within the bird. She delved in detail into the infamous Mardivirus, Marek's disease, and left us with an important take-home message: Marek's disease vaccination is NOT sterilising and does not guarantee the absence of disease!

After the first break, Dr. H. L. Shivaprasad (University of California, Davis) gave an excellent review of the pathology of non-neoplastic poultry diseases. He spoke about the common bacterial (colibacillosis – AEEC commonly involves the ceca-, salmonellosis, mycoplasmosis, bordetellosis

(aspergillosis, and more). fungal candidiasis, megabacteriosis), viral (ILT, infectious bronchitis, Newcastle disease, avian influenza, fowl pox, IBD, transmissible viral proventriculitis, adenovirosis) and parasitic diseases (renal coccidiosis, cryptosporidiosis, leukocytozoonosis, gapeworm infections); lead toxicity and metabolic diseases (amyloidosis, gout, aortic rupture). His collection of photographs is amazing, and the breadth and depth of his knowledge wowed us all!




After lunch, Dr. Monique Franca (University of Georgia) took us through the important clostridial diseases in the chicken and turkey and other differential diagnoses for gastrointestinal necrosis in poultry. Contrary to popular belief, not all clostridial diseases in poultry affect the GI tract! From necrotic enteritis to gangrenous dermatitis, Dr. Franca took us through these diseases with flair and her presentation was accompanied by wonderful images of the diseases themselves. Finally, Dr. Susan Williams (University of Georgia) took pathologists through a refresher on the microscopic diseases of poultry. We are grateful to Dr. Williams for generously taking the time to re-record this webinar following the live webinar, due to a problem with the recording. Dr. Williams is a wealth of knowledge and this session did a great job of tying everything together, with necropsy tips, gross images and discussions on the microscopic appearance of diseases of poultry.

A truly egg-cellent day with something for the whole flock!


Davis-Thompson Foundation Pathology Externship
