Position:

 - One Tenure-Track position in Anatomic Pathology (100%-time faculty appointment).

Requirements:

- Minimum qualifications include: DVM or equivalent veterinary degree and Board certification in Anatomic Pathology.
- This position is a research-focused, tenure-track position that requires that the candidate have at least 60% research effort, have secured NIH (or equivalent extramural) funding, are currently building an independent research program, and have expertise in orthopedic pathology.

Anatomic Pathology Description:

- In addition to developing and demonstrating a successful independent and collaborative research program, the successful candidate will provide didactic teaching in the systemic pathology portion of the veterinary curriculum.

Department:
