



## **2<sup>nd</sup>-YEAR RESIDENT POSITION IN VETERINARY ANATOMIC PATHOLOGY**

The Department of Pathobiological Sciences, School of Veterinary Medicine, University of Wisconsin-Madison seeks applicants for a 2-year training position in anatomic pathology effective August 1, 2024. The program is designed for candidates that have completed at least 1 year of an ACVP-recognized residency training program or equivalent. The aim of the program is to prepare the candidate for the ACVP certifying board examination. The successful candidate will join a team of 4 anatomic pathology residents, 11 ACVP diplomate faculty (6 SVM, 5 WVDL), and 3 diplomate clinical instructors and fellows in Anatomic Pathology. Faculty have expertise in domestic, exotic, wild, and laboratory animal pathology, and subspecialty ocular pathology and neuropathology.

Trainees are exposed to a diverse diagnostic caseload from an array of sources including the new UW Veterinary Medical Center, Milwaukee County and Henry Villas Zoos, Wisconsin DNR, and specialty clinics. The successful candidate will also be exposed to the highly varied and large-volume caseload of the UW RARC Comparative Pathology Laboratory and the Comparative Ocular Pathology Laboratory of Wisconsin (COPLOW). Additional training opportunities include the AAVLD-accredited Wisconsin Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory, Wisconsin National Primate Research Center, and the USGS National Wildlife Health Center. Trainees participate in collaborative research projects based on candidate interest. Opportunities for post-residency graduate training are also available.

Applicants must possess the DVM/VMD or equivalent degree and be eligible for Wisconsin licensure. The successful applicant is required to be licensed in the state of Wisconsin at the start of the position. Required application materials include 1) Letter of intent, 2) Curriculum vitae, 3) Official veterinary college transcripts, 4) 3 letters of reference; provide list of names and ask each referee to send the letter directly to the same email address. If English is your second language, include documentation of English language skills, e.g., TOEFL. For foreign graduate applicants: due to current University visa restrictions, we are able to accept only foreign nationals with a J-1 visa into our program in 2024-25.

Applications are due July 1, 2025 for full consideration, but the position will remain open until filled. The expected start date is August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025, but flexible due to the short application window.
