

Hands-On Training

Students in the DISCOVER program have the unique opportunity to learn hands-on skills related to animal health, husbandry, pathology, and research as well as have a multitude of networking opportunities with peers and industry professionals

Eligibility

The DISCOVER Program is designed for veterinary medical students in their first or second years of veterinary school as well as undergraduates at any level. Limited positions are available and veterinary medical students are given priority.

Pre-veterinary undergraduate students are strongly encouraged to apply for all summer undergraduate research programs for which they are eligible on the Summer Experience site.

Those selected will be awarded a \$6,000 stipend for the 10-week program. Students must make their own housing and transportation arrangements
