Gen Path Rocks at UC Davis in January!



We have rocked another SUCCESSFUL Davis-Thompson General Pathology Review Course! This year, the course returned to UC Davis at the chilly yet bright end of January.

The course provided relevant material, and the material is tied together with journal club sessions, mock exams, and breakout group work sessions. We had graduate student participants who will use the material for their research, many residents imminently taking Phase ACVP exam, and several people in their first year of residency training. We think that participation in the second or third year means that all of your casework helps you directly apply the general pathology knowledge.... and participating in your first year gives you an immediate foundational understanding of disease pathogenesis as your cases start rolling in. The quality of the course drew attendants from as far away as Brazil, England and the Caribbean.

Returning faculty from last year's course at UGA joined the UCD crew with long-time contributor, Brad Bolon of GEMpath fame. For Cell Injury, Dr. James Stanton (UGA) embedded breakout group projects within his lecture to reinforce concepts. For Hemodynamics, Dr. Melinda Camus (UGA) used Kahoot to provide immediate (and fun!) feedback to attendees.



Drs. Erin Ball and Denise Imai (UCD) teamed up to teach immunology and emphasized how to recognize relevant, important and testable material. Dr. Kevin Woolard (UCD) made neoplasia and genetics not only comprehensible but taught with an infectious Chris Farley-level enthusiasm.

Dr. Patty Pesavento (UCD) pulled out all stops during breakout sessions and her lecture hours to present ultrastructural correlates, recent literature and microbial mechanisms of disease in a high-energy and relatable way. Dr. Brad Bolon gave attendees a snap shot view into entry-level toxicologic pathology. All of the faculty contributed mock test questions and the participants were able to take a practice exam and have immediate feedback from faculty with past or current exam committee experience."



29th South Central Division Meeting Oct. 4-5, 2019



Our annual division meeting and slide conference was again well received by the 23 attendees with most from Texas A & M and Louisiana State Universities. Others were from San Antonio, Houston and Little Rock. We again had excellent case reports by mostly pathology residents with some staff members. The slides were collected by Dr. Ed Dick from the attendees in advance and submitted to the Foundation for scanning to the website for review of the histories and histology.

Our invited speaker, Dr. Raquel Rech, from Texas A & M Department of Pathobiology had a very well prepared and delivered lecture on the Pathology of the Diseases of Swine. She had the diseases grouped by what to expect at each age range, which made good sense. She also challenged the group with thought questions similar to a board examination to help the residents, and all of us, gauge what they knew and needed to still study.

Since we were a few case reports fewer this year, Dr. Fabio Del Piero filled in with 2 one-hour sessions on Equine Neuropathology. This was very timely with the reports of EEE this year. He compared the pathology of the various infectious agents and their distribution in the brain. Did you know that the brainstem is the common location for all the infectious agents, with some having further distribution throughout the brain? Did you know that if you see any plasma cells in the inflammation in a horse brain, that rules out a viral etiology (think protozoal)? You would if you came to Galveston.

We'll meet again the first weekend in October next year. The hallmark of the meeting is the Friday night group banquet that everyone enjoys and it makes a great social time to meet your colleagues in the region, so come hungry.

Diagnostic Exercise From The Davis-Thompson Foundation*



Case #117 Month: March Year: 2019

Contributors: Tamires Goneli Wichert Teodoro, Universidade Federal de Lavras (UFLA), Lavras, MG, Brazil. and collagues from the Louisiana State University, LA, USA.

Clinical History: A 4-year-old, female chicken presented for clinical exam with hyperemic comb and legs. The bird was obtunded and with incoordination. The bird died and was submitted for postmortem examination.

Necropsy Findings: The coelomic cavity was distended by approximately 100 ml of yellow opaque fluid containing free-floating soft yellow material. The serosal surfaces of the proventriculus, ventriculus, intestines, spleen, left liver lobe, and ovary as well of the mesentery, coelomic wall, and air sacs were covered by miliary 0.1-0.5 cm diameter, white to tan, firm nodules.





"Seminar of Veterinary Forensic Pathology"

Instituto de Genética (IGUN), Universidad Nacional de Colombia, Bogotá, Colombia, October 30th and 31st, 2019.

The "Seminar of Veterinary Forensic Pathology", was held at the Universidad Nacional de Colombia, in Bogotá, Colombia, on October 30th and 31st, 2019. The meeting was organized by Drs. Jimmy Vargas (IGUN) and Alejandra Arias (CORPAVET), with the participation of more than 40 veterinarians and veterinary students from Colombia, Ecuador and Peru. The session was broadcasted on line with colleagues from Mexico, Colombia and Panama on attendance remotely. The event was sponsored by the Instituto de Genética Universidad Nacional de Colombia (IGUN), Consejo Profesional de Medicina Veterinaria y de Zootecnia de Colombia (COMVEZCOL), ASMEVEF, ACPAVET, BioHazTec, and the Latin Comparative Pathology Group. The keynote speaker was Dr. Jason Brooks, from the Pennsylvania State University, who lectured on Veterinary Forensic Pathology. Dr. Wilson Ramirez from UC Davis presented on Veterinary Forensic and Aquatic Toxicology and Dr. Jimmy Vargas lectured on Forensic Molecular Tools. Drs. Lina Perez and Paola Barato from CORPAVET gave presentations on their experience with Colombian forensic cases and the use of the laboratory quality system ISO 17025 for their chain of custody at the CORPAVET. Drs. Alejandra Arias and Nataly Bacca were awarded with the LCPG Travel Awards for Latin American events. The presentations were of the highest quality and very interactive, with active participation of the audience in all presentations.
